#### MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

**Description of proposal:** Applicant proposes to replace the existing Wallace Elementary school building with a new 2 story facility aprox 46,000 sq feet in size. The original structure will be demolished after completion of the new structure. The property is zoned RSF5, Residential Single Family, 5000. As per KMC Table 17.18.040 this is a permitted use in this zone. Cowlitz Co Parcel number 23434.

# MITIGATED DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE CONDITIONS

Development of the new Wallace Elementary School may occur in a manner consistent with the submitted environmental checklist, site plan, and other supporting documentation with the following conditions.

- 1. The SEPA determination is valid for all three (3) phases of the development as outlined.
  - a. Phase One-Utility relocation and soil stabilization efforts.
  - b. Phase Two-Site grading, site improvements, constructing the new facility.
  - c. Phase Three-Demolition of the current facility, site grading, and site development on the north side.
- 2. The current amount of impervious surface coverage is 99,000 sf, roughly 61% of the site. Any increase in impervious surface on site may require additional permitting and review.
- 3. Civil work described within the checklist is considered the minimum required. Additional work within the right of ways may be required depending on site conditions. All work within the right of ways must be approved by the City Engineer and comply with the Kelso Engineering Design Manual.

The environment threshold determination is based on analysis of information contained in the following documents:

- Environmental Checklist
- Traffic Study prepared by PBS Engineering and Environmental Inc.
- Site Plan prepared by Integrus Architecture, Inc.

#### Notes:

- 1. The issuance of a Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance does not constitute project approval. All building plans and site design must meet the following: 2015 International Fire Code, the 2015 International Building Code, the City of Kelso Engineering Design Manual (KMC Title 13) and the City of Kelso Municipal Code (KMC Title 17) and all other applicable local, state and federal regulations.
- 2. The Mitigated Determination of Nonsignificance is based on the applicant developing the site in accordance with the Stormwater Plan as approved by City of Kelso and site plan



for Wallace Elementary School.

- 3. If contamination is currently known or observed during construction, sampling of the potentially contaminated media must be conducted. If contamination of soil or groundwater is readily visible, or is revealed by sampling, the Department of Ecology must be notified. Contact the Environmental Report Tracking System Coordinator at the Southwest Regional Office at (360) 407-6300. For assistance and information about subsequent cleanup and to identify the type of testing that will be required contact Mr. Dean Phillips at (360) 407-6969.
- 4. Erosion control measures must be in place prior to any clearing, grading, or construction. These control measures must be effective to prevent soil from being carried into surface water by stormwater runoff. Sand, silt, clay particles, and soil will damage aquatic habitat and are considered pollutants.
  - Any discharge of sediment-laden runoff of other pollutants to waters of the state is in violation of Chapter 90.48, Water Pollution Control, and WAC 173-201A, Water Quality Standards for Surface Waters of the State of Washington and is subject to enforcement action.
- 5. During construction, all releases of oils, hydraulic fluids, fuels, other petroleum products, paints, solvents, and other deleterious materials must be contained and removed in a meaner that will prevent their discharge to waters and soils of the state. The cleanup of spills should take precedence over other work.
- 6. In the event any archaeological or historic materials are encountered during project activity, work in the immediate area (initially allowing for a 100' buffer; this number may vary by circumstances) must stop and the following actions taken:
  - a. Implement reasonable measures to protect the discovery sit, including any appropriate stabilization or covering; and
  - b. Take reasonable steps to ensure the confidentiality of the discovery site; and
  - c. Take reasonable steps to restrict access to the site of discovery.

The project proponent will notify the concerned Tribes and all appropriate local, state and federal agencies including the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation and the City of Centralia Community Development. The agencies and Tribes(s) will discuss possible measures to remover or avoid cultural material and will reach an agreement with the project proponent regarding actions to be taken and disposition of material.

If human remains are uncovered, the City of Kelso Police Department shall be notified first and the above steps followed. IF the remains are determined to be Native, consultation with the affected Tribes will take place in order to mitigate the final disposition of said remains.
