<u>Discussion – Proposed Annexation of the South Kelso Unincorporated Areas:</u> Planning Manager Tammy Baraconi and City Attorney Janean Parker presented an overview of the proposed annexation providing the purpose of the annexation, a cost comparison to people affected, and the various methods of processing an annexation provided by State Law.
