<u>Cowlitz County Reimbursable Work Interlocal Agreement:</u> Upon motion by Councilmember Lefebvre, seconded by Councilmember Hill, 'Authorize the City Manager to sign the agreement with Cowlitz County,' motion passed, all voting yes.

<u>Kelso Vision Statement:</u> Upon motion by Councilmember Hill, seconded by Councilmember Lefebvre, 'Adopt the Kelso Vision Statement as presented', motion passed, all voting yes.

Rental Housing Safety Program Discussion: City Manager Taylor and Planning Manager Tammy Baraconi provided an overview on their research regarding rental housing safety programs. Lengthy discussion followed. Upon motion by Councilmember Futcher, seconded by Councilmember Hill, 'Direct staff to create a workplan and bring it back for consideration.' Councilmembers Karnofski, Lefebvre, Futcher, and Hill voted yes. Councilmembers Alexander, Malone, and McAllister voted no. Motion passed, 4 to 3.

City Manager Taylor commented that the staff will bring back information on more options for taking a stand on the house bill.
