Deputy Mayor Lefebvre called the Regular Meeting of the Kelso City Council to order. Councilmembers in attendance were Jeffrey McAllister, Mike Karnofski, Richard McCaine, Keenan Harvey, Lisa Alexander, and Kimberly Lefebvre. Nancy Malone was absent.

<u>Minutes:</u> Upon motion by Councilmember Harvey, seconded by Councilmember McAllister, 'Approve the Minutes of the 2/02/21 Regular Meeting,' motion passed, all voting yes.

PROCLAMATION:

Deputy Mayor Lefebvre read a proclamation declaring March 2021 as "Red Cross Month" in the City of Kelso.

CONSENT AGENDA:

1. <u>Contract Closeout:</u> Tam O'Shanter Parking Improvement Phase II, Advanced Excavating Specialists

Upon motion by Councilmember Harvey, seconded by Councilmember Karnofski, 'Approve the Consent Agenda', motion carried, all voting yes.

2. Auditing of Accounts: \$3,170,081.60

Upon motion by Councilmember Karnofski, seconded by Councilmember Harvey, 'Approve the Auditing of Accounts in the amount of \$3,170,081.60,' motion carried, all voting yes.

COUNCIL BUSINESS:

<u>Interlocal Agreement -- Reimbursable Work Request, Cowlitz County:</u> Upon motion by Councilmember Alexander, seconded by Councilmember McCaine, 'Approve the Reimbursable Work Request with Cowlitz County,' motion passed, all voting yes.

<u>Discussion – Abandoned Vehicles:</u> Councilmember Alexander brought forward a proposal to amend the Kelso Municipal Code, Chapter 10.12, relating to time periods for public parking on city streets and city property. The proposed time period change was from 7 consecutive days to 48 hours, as it was in the past, or to 72 hours. Discussion followed. Upon motion by Councilmember Alexander, seconded by Councilmember Harvey, 'Direct Staff to bring back an ordinance amending the parking time period from 7 days to 72 hours.' Motion passed, all voting yes.

MOTION ITEMS:

Ordinance No. 21-3953 – Adopting 2018 International Building Codes: The Deputy Clerk read the proposed ordinance by title only. Upon motion by Councilmember Karnofski, seconded by Councilmember McAllister, 'Adopt Ordinance No. 21-3953, 'AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KELSO AMENDING ORDINANCE 17-3889, CODIFIED UNDER TITLE 17, UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE OF THE KELSO MUNICIPAL CODE, CHAPTERS 17.50.030 AND 17.50.040 AND 17.50.070 AND 17.50.120, TO REPLACE THE 2015 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE, 2015 INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE, 2015 INTERNATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE AND 2015 UNIVERSAL PLUMBING CODES RECENTLY ADOPTED BY THE WASHINGTON STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL AS SET FORTH HEREIN.' Motion passed all voting yes.

Resolution No. 21-1244 – Amending the Procurement Policies and Procedures: The Deputy Clerk read the proposed resolution by title only. Upon motion by Councilmember Alexander, seconded by Councilmember Harvey, 'Pass Resolution No. 21-1244, 'A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF KELSO, AMENDING THE PROCUREMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES,' motion passed, all voting yes.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Andrew Hamilton: 1) Announced that Cowlitz County had been approved to move into Phase II of the "Healthy Washington Roadmap to Recovery" plan. He commented that city buildings would be opened to the public as of Monday, February 22nd, and that inperson council meetings would resume starting with the March 2nd meeting. 2) Provided a COVID-19 statistic update. 3) Spoke of meetings and training sessions he had recently attended. 4) In answer to a question from Councilmember Harvey, he commented that the in-person meetings would not be available live via Zoom. The in-person council meetings at a 25% capacity (52 people including staff) meet the open public meeting requirements in the Governor's current plan.
