## **COUNCIL BUSINESS:**

Affordable Housing Feasibility Study: Community Frameworks Adam Lee and Mathew Hurd presented a draft feasibility study for a multi-use low-income housing project located at Catlin and Main. Lengthy discussion followed.

<u>Transportation Benefit District Revenue Discussion:</u> Finance Director Brian Butterfield commented that the City will begin receiving TBD sales taxes in June, 2023, from the Department of Revenue. The City anticipates receiving \$200K to \$300K per year. Discussion followed regarding what street construction/maintenance projects to fund first.
