<u>David Sypher:</u> Due to the process delays that have caused so many contractors and developers to be angry with the City, David stated he would like to have the new subdivision ordinance prepared and the process and procedure items completed before the new Community Development Director comes on board. It was the consensus of the Council to put this on the next Council agenda.
