# Kelso Planning Commission Meeting Minutes Tuesday, August 14, 2012 7:01pm – 7:50pm

## Call to Order

Chair Mark Kirkland called the meeting to order at 7:01p.m.

# Minutes:

Commissioner VonRock made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Kirkland to approve the minutes of June 12, 2012. Motion carried, all in favor.

# Presentation:

1. West Main Realignment Project – Vacate portion of NW 7<sup>th</sup> Ave. Presented by Michael Kardas, City of Kelso Senior Civil Engineer overseeing the consultant contracts for this project. Intent to vacate portion of NW 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue between Catlin Street and Cowlitz Way. With improvements to be made at the intersection at West Main Street and Cowlitz Way it will be difficult for that movement to continue without this vacation. It is advantageous for the city to vacate this portion of street and acquire portion of the Kaps lot for intersection improvements. Property will be offered to adjacent property owners at 50 % of assessed value. The vacation is scheduled within the next month or two. Trying to time this with the negotiations with Kaps right-of-way and relocation. Possibly concluded by October and will go to council at that time. For overall project construction intention is to go to ad first of year for spring construction. May not have final settlement on all properties, but city should be granted possession and use to move forward with project.

Commissioner Kirkland - How is vacation going to affect traffic flow? Traffic control and maintaining of detours is in the contract documents for the contractor to develop means and methods with city approval. Project wide - discussed use of Grant and Lincoln Streets to divert traffic. Traffic control will be different dependent on where project is. At a minimum, city plans to post construction schedule on city website. There will be weekly construction meetings with contractor and will post current traffic control diversion measures on website. All emergency responders will be kept informed. Project will take approximately one year. A better, cleaner map was requested be placed on the website. Discussion followed.

 Introduction of Temporary Nuisance Abatement/Planning Technician employee – Jon Rice Started the first part of August. Jon will be working through the end of September, unless council can approve additional money to keep him longer as part time. Since his start date there have been 19 complaints and he has been able to close out 10 of those complaints.

## **Business:**

- 1. Planning Commission Vacancy. Nancy Malone
  - a. Position has been posted and no applications have been received. Discussion followed.
- 2. Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP). Nancy Malone
  - a. **1408 Home Ct.** Quit Claim deed to Lower Columbia Cap was recorded and people have already moved into home.
  - b. Dirk Lane Possible NSP property. City will be looking for additional NSP properties.
  - c. **1124 N. Pacific Ave.** The old Terry Salvage property. A copy of a memo received from Bill Hager with Maul Foster Alongi was given to Planning Commission for review to give a better idea of what cottage housing is and what it is about. Is this something that would work for the City of Kelso? No other city in Cowlitz County has cottage housing. Maul Foster Alongi is working with the city on the environmental and redevelopment plan for this property. There are grants out there for cleanup and housing that they are willing to work with the city as part of the ecology grant. Commissioner Kirkland Have we heard anything back on soil samples? City did receive report and it is not as bad as everyone anticipated. Discussion followed.
- 3. <u>Common Grounds (CAP).</u> 413 S Pacific Avenue Grand Opening August 21, 2012. Soft opening right now. This is a training kitchen open to the public; they also prepare meals on wheels.

# 4. Permits/Kelso Businesses,

- a. Cowlitz Family Health Clinic 300 Oak Street. New development application received to enclose the west portion of the True Value building.
- b. Western Fire 2204 Parrott Way. New office building and storage area application received. Previous office building demolished.
- c. Wilco Farm Store Certificate of Occupancy granted August 8, 2012. Anticipated opening end of August.
- d. US Cellular Retail Store Riverway Plaza. Tenant Improvement application received.
- e. Hickory Hogs S. Pacific Avenue (Old Peter's restaurant). BBQ restaurant anticipated opening end of September.

- g. Commissioner Non Rock How many building does the city own?
- 5. <u>Electronic Signs</u>. Commissioner Kirkland When Re-discussing electronic sign codes take into account new electronic signs motion colors will be grab attention at the expense at having these signs at intersections, this may be a problem. Much more distracting.
- 6. <u>Downtown Design Review Handbook</u> Community Development has received several calls regarding paint colors for the downtown area. Per the Downtown Design Review handbook paint colors should reflect the 19<sup>th</sup> century commercial tradition western design. - 9. Commissioner Kirkland urged fellow commissioners to scout and possibly come up with one person to fill vacant planning commission position.
